## FUND DESCRIPTION

This fund of funds allows for flexible asset allocation with equity exposure which will not exceed 60%. It may also invest in interest-bearing securities, listed and unlisted financial instruments and liquid assets. It solely holds units in local or foreign collective investment schemes or other similar schemes.

The PPS Moderate Fund of Funds aims to outperform inflation by 4% per year over periods longer than 60 months. This fund is managed according to Regulation 28 of the Pension Funds Act and therefore is a suitable standalone vehicle for retirement savings.

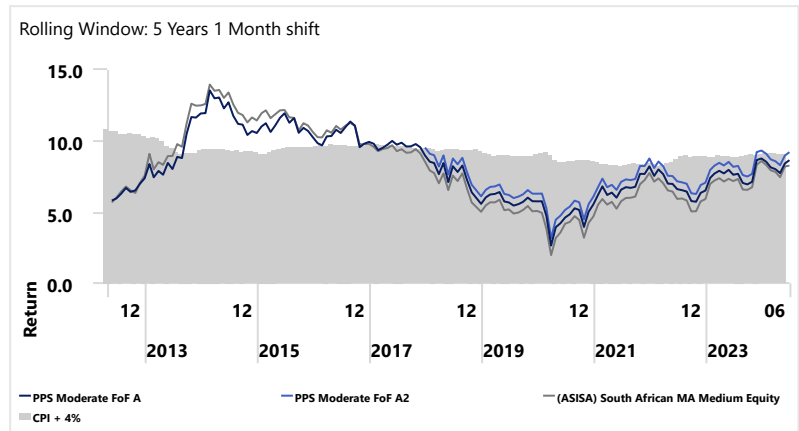
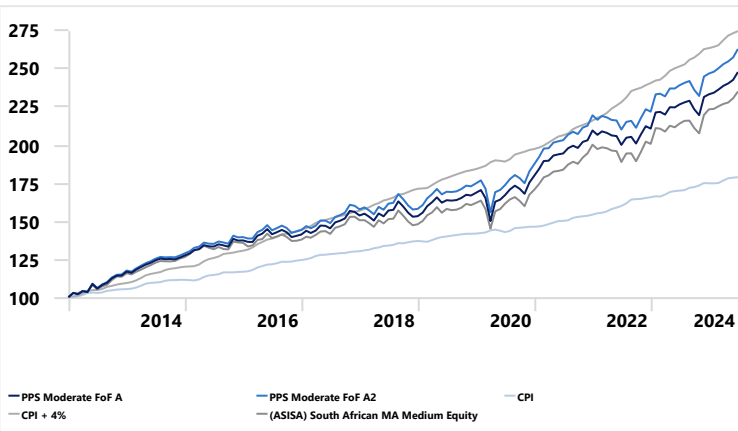

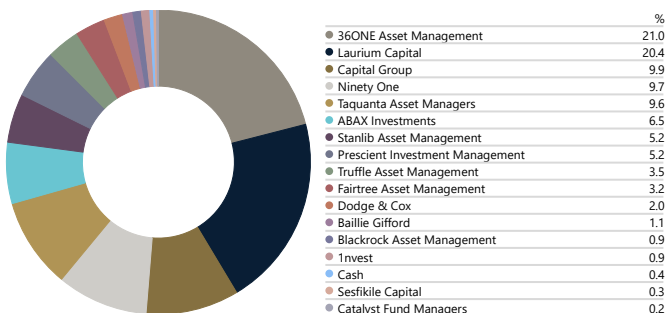

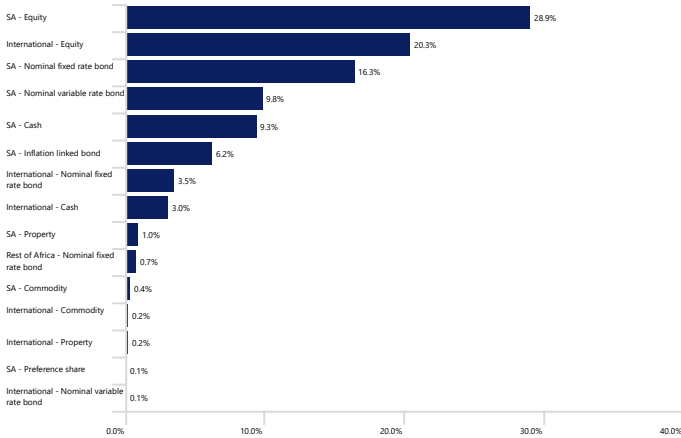

## FUND COMMENTARY

This FoF targets CPI+4% p.a. over rolling five years. Diversification is achieved both on an asset class and manager level. Approximately half the FoF is invested according to our house-view allocation (that aims to achieve CPI+4% p.a. over rolling five years at the lowest possible risk) while the remainder is invested with multi-asset class managers that follow their own strategies (and help mitigate our internal model risk).

Financial markets remained preoccupied by the US economy's "soft landing" potential, which refers to high interest rates guiding inflation back towards target, without causing the economy to go into a recession. Equity market strength was concentrated in the US and emerging markets, where even South Africa was a top performer following the elections. The formation of a coalition Government of National Unity in SA marks a historic moment for the country. Prior to this, SA operated as a "party-state", with the ruling ANC controlling all state institutions, including state-owned enterprises.

South African equities (FTSE/JSE Capped SWIX) rallied this quarter (+8.2%), benefitting from the increased appetite for domestic assets. Financials were up strongly (+17.1%), with banks contributing almost half the market's gain. The FTSE/JSE All Bond Index delivered a solid gain (+7.5%), almost on par with the SA equity market this quarter. The market is optimistic that the new government provides a window to potentially implement much needed pro-growth structural reforms; with growth being critically important in tackling the rising sovereign debt burden.

Global equities (MSCI All Country World) advanced in dollars but declined in rand terms this quarter (-0.8%), after the dollar weakened against the rand (-3.6%). Within global equities, developed markets underperformed emerging markets (-1.2% vs +1.0%), where investor sentiment was bolstered by favourable election results in India and South Africa. Global bonds were down in rands (-5.1%), with lingering inflation worries affecting the US outlook for rates.

Over the five-year investment horizon of the FoF, SA equities (up 8.7% p.a.) have underperformed foreign equities (up 16.6% p.a.), while SA nominal bonds (up 7.8% p.a.) have outperformed SA inflation-linked bonds (up 6.4% p.a.), SA cash (up 6.0% p.a.) and SA inflation (5.0%). The FoF has outperformed its peer group benchmark over the most recent 5-year investment horizon, but has underperformed the CPI+4% target as all asset classes apart from global equities have not achieved this hurdle.

Our house view remains neutral global equities but upweighted SA equities this quarter to overweight, as the prospects for domestic equities improved. The multi-asset (MA) component of the FoF consists of a combination of MA managers from the MA low equity, MA medium equity and MA high equity categories, that in combination results in an asset allocation aligned to the MA medium equity category. The underlying manager lineup has not changed this quarter. The underlying managers are Ninety One, Abax, Laurium and 36One, which collectively delivered a competitive return relative to the ASISA medium equity category quarter.

The fund has adhered to its policy objective.

## DISCLOSURES

Collective Investment Schemes in Securities (CIS) are generally medium-to long-term investments. The value of participatory interests (units) may go down as well as up, and past performance is not necessarily a guide to future performance. **Total Expense Ratio (TER)** is a measure that can be used by investors and advisers to determine how much of a CIS's underlying assets are relinquished as payment for services rendered in the administration of the CIS. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER may not necessarily be an accurate indication of future TER's.

**Transaction Costs (TC)** is a measure that can be used by investors and advisers to determine the costs incurred in buying and selling assets underlying the CIS. TC's are a necessary cost in administering the CIS and impact CIS's returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of CIS, the investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

**Total Investment Charges (TIC)** is a measure of total cost relating to the investment. TIC is the sum of the total expense ratio (TER) and the transaction cost (TC).

TER's and TC's are expressed as a percentage of the daily net asset value of the CIS calculated over the past one year and three-year period on an annualised basis. The TER and TC disclosed are estimates based on our best estimate of the underlying costs.

These performance figures are for lump sum investments with income distributions reinvested on the ex-dividend date. All PPS Multi-Managers performance figures and values are quoted after the deduction of costs and applicable taxes incurred within the Fund. Actual investment performance will differ based on the initial fees applicable, the actual investment date and the date of the reinvestment of income and dividend withholding tax. The reinvestment of income is calculated based on actual distributed amount and factors such as payment date and reinvestment date will be considered. Please note that performance over periods greater than one year is annualised. Annualised performance is the average return earned on an investment each year over a given time period. Performance is based on NAV to NAV calculations and calculated on a rolling monthly basis. The past performance is relevant to the investment or the service offered by the manager.

This fund is exposed to foreign securities and as such, it may be subject to the macroeconomic, settlement risks and political risks brought about by this exposure. It may also be subject to currency risk, which means the underlying investments of the fund could depreciate or appreciate against the reporting currency of the investor. Unit Trust prices are calculated on a Net Asset Value basis, which is the total market value of all assets in the portfolio including any income accruals and less any deductible expenses from the Fund divided by the number of units in issue. Transactions must be received by the Management Company (MANCO) by 2pm to receive the net asset value price for that day. Transaction requests received after this cut off time will only be processed on the next business day, and will receive the price of that day. Linked Investment Service Providers (LISP), specify their own transaction timelines and may take up to five business days to process. Portfolio valuations occur at 3 p.m. on business days, except the last business day of the month, when it will be 5pm. Prices are published daily and are available in the daily newspapers.

A schedule of fees, charges and maximum commissions are available on request. This fund does not charge performance fees.

The manager may close the portfolio to new investors to ensure the portfolio is managed according to its mandate.
