## **FUND DESCRIPTION**

The PPS Bond Fund is available as a building block to both retail and institutional investors. The benchmark has recently changed from the JSE All Bond Index (ALBI) to 50% JSE All Bond Index (ALBI) and 50% JSE Composite Inflation Linked Index (CILI). This allows the underlying managers to have exposures to both nominal and inflation linked bonds, with discretion as to the allocation to each. The underlying managers are restricted from purchasing non-investment grade paper, but are given reasonable allowance in terms of duration compared to the benchmark.

The PPS Bond Fund aims to outperform the 50% ALBI, 50% CILI benchmark over periods longer than 36 months. This fund is managed according to Reg. 28 of the Pension Funds Act and therefore is a suitable standalone vehicle for retirement savings.

### **Fund Commentary**

The bond fund aims to outperform a 50:50 split between nominal and inflation-linked bonds (50% All Bond Index: 50% Composite Inflation Linked Index). The fund will behave quite differently from peers in the short-term, given most peers only invest in nominal bonds, but it will lead to more consistent performance over time.

The first quarter of 2020 is characterised by the COVID-19 pandemic and the lockdowns in many countries around the world. Governments have rightfully made the decision to try to safeguard citizens by limiting personal interaction and effectively closing non-essential businesses for a lockdown period. This has had a negative effect on asset prices globally and an expectation of widespread recessions to follow. For the quarter SA cash (up 1.7%) has outperformed both SA nominal bonds (down 8.7%) and SA inflation-linked bonds (down 6.6%) as SA yields rose on the back of developing market concerns and the ratings downgrade by Moody's to junk status. SA cash returned 7.2% over the past year, and outperformed shorter-dated SA bonds (up 6.8%), longer-dated SA bonds (down 3.0%) and SA inflation-linked bonds (down 4.7%).

Both underlying managers in the fund have considerable discretion in how to allocate between nominal and inflation linked bonds, and the duration risk they can assume relative to the benchmark. Relative to the benchmark, Prescient is overweight inflation-linked bonds (in both duration and allocation) while Stanlib remains somewhat underweight. The increase in nominal and real yields has meant that both managers have been willing to add duration, although the nominal versus inflation-linked split between the two managers remains intact.

The significant correction in financial assets this quarter does not necessary reflect a permanent loss of capital, but significant market uncertainty as to the likely economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Importantly, markets have already discounted the very negative short-term economic implications of the lock-down, and will price in a more favourable scenario should economic conditions begin to improve.

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#### **DISCLOSURES**

Portfolio valuations occur at 3 p.m. on business days, except the last business day of the month, when it will be 5pm. Prices are published daily and are available in the daily newspapers.

The manager may close the portfolio to new investors to ensure the portfolio is managed according to its mandate.

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
