FUND DESCRIPTION

The PPS Bond Fund is available as a building block to both retail and institutional investors. The benchmark has recently changed from the JSE All Bond Index (ALBI) to 50% JSE All Bond Index (ALBI) and 50% JSE Composite Inflation Linked Index (CILI). This allows the underlying managers to have exposures to both nominal and inflation linked bonds, with discretion as to the allocation to each. The underlying managers are restricted from purchasing non-investment grade paper, but are given reasonable allowance in terms of duration compared to the benchmark.

The PPS Bond Fund aims to outperform the 50% ALBI, 50% CILI benchmark over periods longer than 36 months. This fund is managed according to Reg. 28 of the Pension Funds Act and therefore is a suitable standalone vehicle for retirement savings.

FUND COMMENTARY

The bond fund aims to outperform a 50:50 split between nominal and inflation-linked bonds (50% All Bond Index: 50% Composite Inflation Linked Index). The fund will behave quite differently from peers in the short-term, given most peers only invest in nominal bonds, but it will lead to more consistent performance over time.

GDP growth, although still negative for 2020, ended better than previously expected and there was an improvement in the forecast for 2021. In addition, inflation has remained muted in South Africa, ending the quarter slightly below the bottom end of the target band. The US and UK has led globally with vaccine roll-outs while SA has been making slow progress. However, the slowing of COVID-19 infections locally has been positive for the economy as more businesses have been able to operate under the current level of restrictions.

Over the three year investment horizon SA nominal bonds in total were up 5.5% p.a., while short dated bonds were up 8.4% p.a. and long dated bonds were up 3.2% p.a. Cash delivered a reasonable return of 5.9% p.a. and inflation-linked bonds were up only 2.5% p.a. The retail classes of the fund do not yet have a three year track record.

For the quarter the fund delivered a return of 1.2% which marginally underperformed the 50% ALBI and 50% CILI benchmark and was in the first quartile of peer relative performance. The two underlying managers Prescient and Stanlib experienced different fortunes mainly as a result of their different underlying asset allocation. The PPS Bond Fund does have a higher inflation-linked bond component in the benchmark than peers. The underlying managers have allowance to significantly overweight or underweight the nominal versus real holding in their portfolios. Prescient have been early in their purchases of real yield, which has not benefitted the fund relative to the nominal bond performance, which Stanlib was maintained an underweight inflation-linked bond exposure relative to the benchmark.
